

ANKARA'DA GEZİLEBİLECEK YERLER

During their free time at the congress, participants can explore the historical and cultural richness of Ankara. Visits to Anıtkabir and Ankara Castle will provide insight into the city's historical heritage and offer panoramic views. At the Museum of Anatolian Civilizations and the Museum of Ethnography, visitors can delve into the region's deep-rooted past.

The War of Independence and Republic Museums will show important documents related to Türkiye's independence process, while different themes will be explored in unique museums such as the Word Museum, and fossils, minerals and geological formations will be examined in the MTA Natural History Museum. Participants can take a historical journey at Ulucanlar Prison Museum or visit Altınköy Open Air Museum to experience traditional village life.

Moreover, visitors can take a stroll through the historic streets of Hamamönü, featuring restored Ottoman-era houses, or relax in the peaceful atmosphere of Kuğulu Park. These locations provide an excellent opportunity to immerse oneself in Ankara's rich cultural heritage.

It is the mausoleum of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the founder of the Republic of Türkiye. Visitors can see Atatürk's mausoleum and the Atatürk and War of Independence Museum.
